Dickinson at Biennale Internazionale dell'Antiquariato di Firenze (BIAF) 21 - 29 September 2019 | Stand 7 Preview Day: 20 September

Dickinson Gallery marks its first appearance at BIAF in Florence with Italian Old Masters and a number of key 20<sup>th</sup> century pieces. This will be the 31<sup>st</sup> edition of the Fair, which takes place at Palazzo Corsini. Stand highlights include an impressive group of Venetian vedute by celebrated 18<sup>th</sup> century view painters Canaletto and Guardi, as well as Modern Fauve and Cubist works, including Kees van Dongen's vibrant 1911 portrait *Plumes Blanches*.

To honour this, the 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Fair's foundation, Dickinson will showcase Old Masters focusing on Italian artists and subjects. The earliest work on view will be a rare gold ground panel by *trecento* master Niccolò di Segna, originally part of a *predella*. From the 18<sup>th</sup> century Dickinson will exhibit three views by Canaletto, including an early pair commissioned by an English Grand Tourist, and his 1746 masterpiece *The Redentore, Venice;* Guardi's *San Giorgio Maggiore from the Giudecca,* a version of one of his most popular subjects; and a rococo *Vision of St. Jerome* by Francesco Fontebasso. A 19<sup>th</sup> century view of *The Campagna di Roma, the Alexandrine Aqueducts,* by the English painter Edward Lear, captures one of the many picturesque views near Rome.





Among the featured 20<sup>th</sup> century works offered for sale is Van Dongen's superb and richly textured *Plumes Blanches*, which depicts an elegant sitter in his characteristic Fauvist idiom. Dickinson will also feature colourful Cubist compositions by Juan Gris, represented by a still life painting and works on paper; and by Joaquín Torres-García. Two bronze sculptures and drawings by Henri Laurens also follow the Cubist theme. The Cuban Surrealist Wifredo Lam's *L'Oiseau blanc*, from a private American collection, was exhibited at the Venice Biennale in 1972.

Dickinson will be one of 16 new international exhibitors among the 77 galleries represented at BIAF 2019.
